From the President

This Budget Bulletin has been sent to you to provide helpful information about the Shire's budget for the next financial year and how we spend the money we receive from your rates.

On behalf of my fellow Councillors, I am excited to share with you the highlights of our 2019-20 budget.

Recreation and leisure is one of our priorities this year with almost \$700,000 allocated for improvements across the region including new shade sails at Marble Bar Skate Park, new playground equipment in Newman, upgrades to Newman and Marble Bar Aquatic Centre, new gym equipment at Newman Recreation Centre and much more.

Road safety continues to be of great importance to Council which is why we have allocated almost \$5.4 million to continue to improve our road network for residents and visitors across the Shire.

We have also allocated almost \$6.3 million to our Wastewater Treatment Plant for upgrades to future proof our sustainable irrigation source to our ovals and green spaces in Newman. The project will result in a leading industry facility, with the upgrades increasing both the capacity and efficiency of the system.

Another change you may have noticed is that we have reduced the number of different rate categories from twelve to three. This will mean we are close to the fairest, most equitable and most efficient method of rate levying available. We are changing what we do to make the rate levying process fairer for everyone.

Whilst the majority of ratepayers won't see a significant difference in their annual rates, the changes will have an impact on some ratepayers.

Did you know that paying your rates on time goes a long way to helping us to deliver our projects sooner? Many people don't realise this. To encourage this, the Shire has provided Early Rates Incentives which you can see on page three.

The Shire of East Pilbara continues to strive to fulfil the goals we have publicly outlined in our Strategic Community Plan; that we are committed to diverse and sustainable economic growth balanced with the conservation and enhancement of our unique environmental assets, and rich history and heritage.

Putting into perspective



The Shire of East Pilbara is the **largest Shire in the southern hemisphere**. The Shire is larger than the state of Victoria and roughly the same size as Japan.



At the center of the Shire is Karlamilyi National Park and at **1,283,706 hectares** is the largest national park in Western Australia and **one of the largest in the world**.



At the northern most point of the Shire is the **4,800** hectare pristine coastal area of **Cape Keraudren**. A full time ranger is employed by the Shire to oversee and maintain this area.



Employment within the Shire is focussed on the **mining sector** which contributes **75% of employment**, followed by construction sector jobs (5%), and administrative and support services sector jobs (4%).



Marble Bar Road is predominantly gravelled for the **303 kilometres** between Marble Bar and Newman. Marble Bar has the reputation of being Australia's hottest town.



It is estimated that **15,353 people** work in East Pilbara which represents **24%** of the 63,850 people working in the entire Pilbara Region.

Vote for your Councillors

The next local government ordinary elections will be held on 19 October 2019 and the Shire of East Pilbara is looking to fill five vacancies

If you live in or own rateable property in the Shire of East Pilbara and meet the relevant eligibility criteria, then you are entitled to vote at Council elections. However, in order to do so you must be enrolled either on the State Electoral Roll for an address within the Shire, or on the Shire's Owners and Occupiers Roll

If you are enrolled on the State electoral roll and you are listed as living at an address within the Shire of East Pilbara, then you will be automatically included on the local government electoral roll for this Shire. However, if you are an owner or occupier of property within the Shire of East Pilbara but are enrolled on the State roll at an address outside the Shire, or are not currently listed on any electoral roll, then you must apply for inclusion on the Shire's Owners and Occupiers Roll.



Did you know

The mining sector dominates the Shire of East Pilbara's economic landscape. Mining is estimated to contribute \$15.174 billion (90%) of total output generated within the Shire, followed by construction \$432 million (2%) and manufacturing \$192 million (1%). Employment within the Shire is focused on the mining sector which contributes 11,516 jobs (75% of employment), followed by construction sector 707 jobs (5%) and administrative and support services sector 585 jobs (4%).

It is estimated that 15,353 people work in East Pilbara representing 24.05% of the 63,850 people working in Pilbara Region, 1.32% of the 1,166,087 people working in Western Australia and 0.14% of the 10,683,322 people working in Australia.





Shire of East Pilbarasewerage rates

Each year households in Newman receive two sewerage rates, one from Water Corporation and another from the Shire – why is this?

A number of public meetings were held in 1995 regarding the operation of the Newman Treatment Plant, which at the time was operated by the Water Corporation.

This was because the Water Corporation planned to discontinue the use of the treatment plant and replace it with 'facultative ponds'. The treated water using a pond system would have caused a rapid deterioration of grassed areas and street trees within the town due to the higher salt content of water using this method of water treatment.

Instead, based on community feedback, the Shire opted to take over the treatment plant, and charge sewerage rates to assist in the maintenance and operation of the plant. The treated water could then continue to be used to maintain green parks and public spaces around Newman.

Sewerage rates paid to the Council assist in the maintenance and operation of the treatment plant. This operation is funded from a combination of rates raised and a Water Corporation contribution of an annual fee (\$84,500 in 1996 and since indexed to CPI). Rates paid to the Water Corporation are for water supply.

Pensioners and Seniors

Pensioners and Seniors who register with the Shire of East Pilbara are entitled to a rebate on Council rates and the Emergency Services Levy (ESL), or in some circumstances may defer payment of the rates and ESL until such time as the property is sold, vacates the property or is deceased.

Annual charges for rubbish collection and pool inspection fees still need to be paid within the usual 35 day period and cannot be deferred. Pensioner card holders may be eligible for a rebate up to 50%, up to a capped amount of \$750.00. Senior card holders may be eligible to claim a rebate up to 25% off the current years rates, capped at the amount of

To register your entitlement for a rebate, you may apply over the phone by contacting the Water Corp on 1300 659 951 or lodge an online application via www.watercorporation.com.au.

The rebate to pensioners and seniors under the Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Act 1992 are funded by the Government of Western Australia.

Your rates

Frequently asked questions:

Why do I pay rates?

Your rates help the Shire of East Pilbara to provide services, construction and maintenance in the local community, such as, roads, parks, gardens, sporting facilities, animal control, bush fire control, library services, aquatic centre and much more.

Why have my rates risen this year?

To make the rate levying process fairer, we have reduced the number of different rate categories from twelve to three which means we are close to the fairest, most equitable and most efficient method of rate levying available.

Whilst the majority of ratepayers won't see a significant difference in their annual rates, the changes will have an impact on some ratepayers.

How are rates calculated?

Every three to five years, properties in the Shire of East Pilbara are subject to a revaluation set by Landgate for rating and tax purposes. Rates are calculated using your property's valuation multiplied by the annual rate in the dollar imposed by Council.

Within the Shire, there are two types of valuations: Gross Rental Values (GRV) for town sites and Unimproved Values (UV) for rural areas.

Can I appeal my property's valuation?

Yes, you can appeal your property's valuation (not the rate in the dollar as imposed by Council). You can discuss your valuation with a Landgate Valuer on (08) 9273 7373. Further information is available at www.landgate.wa.gov.au. An appeal must be submitted within 60 days of the rates notice being issued.

The Local Government Act 1995 states that rates must be paid as assessed irrespective of an objection being lodged. Any reduction in rates resulting from a successful appeal will be refunded.

Can I receive my rates notice via email?

Ratepayers can register to receive their rate notices via email, simply send your request via email to rates@eastpilbara.wa.gov.au, visit us at the Shire of East Pilbara or contact us on (08) 9175 8000.

If valuations have gone down, why are my rates not cheaper?

Even though valuations have gone down, the Shire of East Pilbara still need to maintain the same level and quality of services in the local community.

What are the other charges included with the rates?

Other charges on your rates notice include, rubbish collection, sewerage and the Emergency Services Levy (ESL).

What should I do if I change my address?

If you have changed ownership of a property or moved house, please contact the Council within 21 days as there is an obligation for property owners to ensure the Shire has correct address for service of notices. You can fill in the change of address on the reverse side of your rates notice and return to the Shire office.

Example of how your rates are calculated:

Property GRV: \$31,000

Rate in the dollar: 4.4963 cents

\$31,000 x 4.4963 cents = \$1,393.85 in rates plus other Council levies and charges.




